DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

My tenure with SOMOS Mayfair has been incredibly humbling. I have been touched and amazed to see the Bay Area community come together to support our children and families over the last 22 years. We are doing deep and intentional work and cannot thank you enough for investing the time, effort, and resources that enables us to be increasingly successful year upon year.

Since the launch of the In Our Hands campaign in 2012, which reorganized our work around our Leadership Development Model, SOMOS has not only doubled in size, but also doubled its impact! We went from a small and committed staff of **9** to a connected, passionate, and competent staff of **21** individuals. We went from serving **700** children and families in 2012 to serving **1,400** children and families annually. Recent successes include:

- Increasing school readiness by 37% and 3rd grade reading proficiency by 50%
- Developing the leadership of 200+ community members
- Serving as an incubator for **18 Promotoras** who recently launched their own cooperative
- Operating a flagship **Family Resource Center** for ALL Alum Rock students and families
- Championing a **Restorative Justice** curriculum for ALL Alum Rock schools
- Winning financing for a **100% affordable housing project** that will double as SOMOS' new home, and
- Continuing to advocate for an **equitable school system** for our Alum Rock students

SOMOS is incredibly proud of the work we have accomplished. This is a community in motion, and through this annual report we want to share a glimpse into the windows of change that reveal what is happening here and now. As we continue our commitment to developing leaders, making strides in early education, building momentum through community organizing, and providing economic opportunity, we invite you to be a part of the movement.

OUR WORK

Leadership Development

Leadership development begins with community members recognizing their strengths and experience. Through mentorship, learning and practice, we build a leadership that generates more leaders. In SOMOS' Universidad Popular de Mayfair, leaders continue their growth, further developing skills and deepening their analysis to sustain changes in the neighborhood.

Recent Wins: 80% of Growing Together participants reported an increase in leadership at home, school, or in the community



Early Education

Certified *Promotores* lead peer-to-peer programs and activities with parents and children to promote family learning. The mobile library, Reading Circles, Bridge to Kindergarten, and all Family Resource Center programs work to close the opportunity gap by third grade.

Recent Wins: School Readiness increased from 5% to 42% for Bridge To Kinder participants; The County approved an Early Learning Pilot program



Community Organzing


Community organizing supports movement building in our neighborhood and schools. Parents and residents engage in participatory action, analysis, priority setting, relationship building, and tactical strategies to advance an equity platform developed by community, for community.

Recent Wins: Restorative Justice will be implemented in ARUSD schools as part of *EMPUJE's* organizing efforts; *Vecinos Activos* has impacted the timeline for the development of a city-wide anti-displacement policy



Economic Opportunity

Families need economic opportunity and mobility to support their children and break cycles of poverty. In response, SOMOS has launched SOMOS Fuertes, which provides *Promotores* with job training and placement to further advance opportunity and social justice in Mayfair and beyond.







FINANCIAL OVERVIEW FY18










FINANCIAL OVERVIEW FY15 - FY18
